Instructions on OAS Skill Modules

Skill module assignments for OAS: As a condition for passing the course, you must submit for approval by the end of the semester a minimum of 14 skill module assignments. Each of these skill modules will require on the order of 2 to 6 hours of work to complete and it is reasonable to think that you would schedule that amount of time each week to complete the work.

Note that the 14 skill modules are divided as follows:

- 8 required modules that everyone in the class will complete
- 2 or 3 elective STEM skill modules, selected from a large menu of options
- 2 or 3 elective arts and humanities skill modules, selected from a large menu of options
- 1 getting out and about Austin skill module, selected from a large menu of options

Choosing your skill modules. The eight required modules are divided into those that prepare you for inquiries (like creating a bibliography for the humanities inquiry) and those that initiate you into the intellectual life on a college campus (attending a scholarly lecture or using the library.) But you choose the other 6 skill modules and it makes sense for you to plan ahead on selecting the over 30 elective skill modules from the list found at:

Turn in skill modules directly to your UGTA. All grading for these required skill module assignments will be done by UGTAS who are expected to return graded skill modules within two week at your cohort meetings.

Please keep your graded skill modules to turn in with your class work portfolio submitted at the end of the semester.
