- 3. For the make-up exam I will try to make it as consistent with my review materials on question types as I can.
- 4. A reminder that the extra credit for science haters is due by the time I wake up in the morning.

- 5. Some things I would be able to do if I was taking this exam:
 - You have to be able to separate the standard seven step acid base stuff we are doing from the new material that does not assume approximations. So start acid base question by asking, step 0, can I do the seven step approximation stuff? The answer is yes if C is high and Ks are far apart. If no, then it must be one of the several special case problems you know are coming.
 - Being able to do the seven step procedure to find a pH is not the same as being able to explain what is happening physically in an acid base system. Titration curve theory, polyprotic acid theory, ranking from Ks, acid-base approximations, sulfuric acid calculation, the two complex equilibrium questions and the alpha diagram interpretation require you to think, not calculate.
 - There are at least three actual calculations of pH on this exam for which the answers provided eliminate all but the correct answer WITHOUT doing a calculation. This only benefits those who know what to look for.
 - Do you know how often knowing that pH = pKa is good to know? It directly impacts several answers in providing immediate access to the right answer. So if you see a buffer and it is 1:1 as a starting point in solving a problem, you are very close to an answer already.
 - I haven't covered the structure of amino acids specifically, and one will be on the test, so be aware of the following. In an amino acid with two acid base sites (one and acid and one a base) you can have either 2, 1 or 0 protons depending on the pH.

HOOC- R- NH3+ is most protonated and at the lowest pH (like the H₂A form)

-OOC- R- NH3+ is the amphiprotic species equivalent to HA

-OOC- R- NH2 is the deprotonated form and is found at the highest pH (like the A form)

- You have to be able to back-substitute and will do it twice for problems with quadratic equations on this exam. Set up the equation, know that what you solve for in the equation is what is wanted, and then plug away. Only one answer will make the equality happen. You can solve the quadratic equation as an alternative, but this way will work. Promise.
- There are four solubility problems on the quiz. In order of challenge they are: molar solubility, ranking solubility, common ion and selective precipitation. Before you work one of them, know what it is. They aren't in order.
- PLEASE write down both the solubility reaction and its RICE array AND the full K_{sp} equilibrium expression on each problem. It will save the guaranteed stupid mistakes when you forget to divide by 4 or take square a number.
- For the selective precipitation problem, look at the bullet just above and appreciate that salts of different types, when compared (like AB versus AB2) do not have solubilities that scale proportionally with the K_{sp} as occurs with acids.
